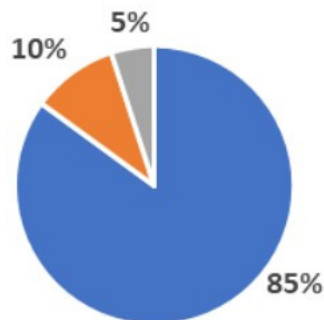


Loveland City School District Frequently Asked Questions

How will the funds be used?

About 85% of money generated will go toward continuing our current programming, with 10% to restore high school busing, and 5% to allow for up to 5 additional staff members, if needed, over the next three years.

Utilization of 4.9 Mill Operating Levy Funds



- Maintain current educational programming
- Restore high school busing (when necessary drivers are employed)
- 5 additional staff members if needed due to enrollment/programming

Why is a levy needed?

The state of Ohio is the only state without any inflationary adjustment for education funding. In order to maintain local control, we must either ask our community for additional funding or make substantial cuts. Before making cuts, and eliminating programs, we feel it is important to give the voters an opportunity to approve additional funding.

How much will the levy cost me?
